WORKSHOP DESCRIPTIONS

Getting Involved.... The Maryland 4-H Horse Program Wants You!

The possibilities are endless! Opportunities for all! Learn how to use your unique talents to become an integral part of the Maryland 4-H Horse Program. This workshop is for new 4-H Volunteers and teens who want to get involved in statewide activities.

The 4-H Meeting: How Do Our Heads, Hearts, Hands, and Health Fit Into the Picture?

What is an effective 4-H meeting? How do we make sure we take care of our business, yet have fun, too? If you are interested in how to run an effective, fun, rewarding 4-H meeting, attend this session. Be prepared to share ideas, and test them with your peers, as we explore how to make our 4-H meeting work for us!

Managing Live Horse Events - the Pitfalls and the Rewards:

Learn how to plan and manage horse events from shows to clinics to trail rides. The session will focus on best practices for managing the risks while providing a satisfying experiential learning opportunity for your members.

What's Your Mane Issue....Exhibiting Positive Character in 4-H:

What's your problem now? The 4-H is a Youth Development program that follows the pillars of Character Counts, adults and parents that volunteer should also follow these pillars. In this session you will learn about the pillars of character when working with the horse project and learn to deal with conflict in a positive way. Lets get off your "high horse" and stop "horsing around" and learn to deal with disagreements, in return your programs will be more successful.

SMART Goals: Purposeful Planning for Project Success:

Only one person can be the champion. Does that mean the others didn't accomplish their goals? Not necessarily! Come learn how we can help our youth to set SMART goals for their projects that will leave them feeling empowered and successful no matter what their placing in competition and learn to support each other in the process.

The 21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership:

In this workshop participants will explore leadership principles that have stood the test of time. John Maxwell's revised and updated "21 Irrefutable Laws of Leadership" can help leaders to more effectively work with their 4-H horse clubs.

The Ins and Outs of Equine Nutrition:

Review the important and unique features of the equine digestive tract that directly relate to proper feeding management practices. Don't miss this opportunity to learn feeding management strategies that will keep your horse happy, healthy, and performing well.

Be Prepared! Home First Aid For Your Horse:

In case of an equine emergency, it is important for you to have the necessary supplies on hand at your facility. Participants will learn the essentials for a home equine first aid kit so that they are prepared should an emergency occur.

Eat Right, Be Fit, Ride Better:

This session will focus on being physically ready to ride by achieving a proper balance of hydration, energy and fitness through improving knowledge and skills in these areas. The session will include some hands-on activities that can be used with 4-Hers both mounted and on the ground.

Reining in Your Public Speaking Anxiety:

Everyone gets nervous! With the proper tools, youth and adults can learn to produce successful horse communications projects and have fun through the process. Resources and activities will be provided that can easily be used in your leadership roles.
